Overview of the school

Nature of support 2013/14

Additional support in Literacy & Maths from teaching assistants in the classroom and in intervention groups across the school.

Target intervention for year 1 children for Phonics placement test.

Small-group tuition for yr 2 children who did not reach the pass rate in the year 1 Phonics Screening.

Release of teachers to provide 1:1/ small group work for PuPs across the school.

2 staff to lead Forest Schools provision to develop confidence and encourage outdoor learning for Pupil Premium pupils.

Small group sizes in year 6, 2 & 1 and in year 5 post SATs.

TAs support in Key Stage 2, especially years 3 to provide additional support for all pupils but especially PuPs/ SEN/ lower achievers.

Learning Mentor to provide social and emotional support for all pupils.

Attendance of all pupils but especially Pupil Premium children to be monitored more closely and strategies put in place to support families.

Curriculum focus of PPG (pupil premium grant) spending 2013/14

Additional support for year 2 children that did not achieve the pass rate in the Year 1 phonics test in 2013.

Additional support in Literacy & Maths from teaching assistants in the classroom and in intervention groups across the school.

Smaller groups and target teaching within identified areas of the curriculum.

Money allocated to create 'fire pit' in school grounds for Forest Schools project, which targets Pupil Premium children.

Involvement in music projects offered through the LA and consortium.

Money allocated to account for shortfall in trips when Pupil Premium children have not contributed/ or paid full amount to school trips.


Curriculum resources provided to accelerate the progress of Pupil Premium children.


Measuring the impact of PPG (pupil premium grant) spending

The school will evaluate the impact on each pupil at the end of each term. Evaluation will focus on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the intervention.

Data for Reception Years 1, 2 & 6 (year groups who have data reported Nationally) will be presented to Governors so they can make comparisons to: progress from the schools' previous data, progress of cohorts based on previous performance and National data. This will enable them to provide challenge where appropriate.

2013 results:

-  **Yr 1 Pupil Premium** children at Wylde Green have performed better than other Pupil Premium children nationally in the Phonics Screening test.
- ✓ This demonstrates excellent progress from 2012, when Wylde Green Pupil Premium children in year 1 performed significantly below National Pupil Premium children in the Phonics Screening test.
- ✓ Money was well deployed to ensure this improvement.
- ❖ Ensuring that Yr 1 Pupil Premium are achieving above national is a target this year.

-  **Yr 2 Pupil Premium** children at Wylde Green have performed largely in line with than other Pupil Premium children nationally at Level 2 and above in the Key Stage 1 SATs. They have not performed as well in the higher grades.

- ✓ *School targeted the Pupil Premium children to ensure they were performing at least in line with National Pupil Premium children, as predictions were that they would perform well below. This demonstrates that school exceeded expected results for these children.*

- ✓ *Money was well deployed to ensure this improvement.*

- ❖ *Ensuring that Yr 2 Pupil Premium are achieving above national as well as improving the higher grades achieved by these children at Wylde Green, is a target this year.*

- ✚ ***Yr 6** Pupil Premium children at Wylde Green have made significant progress and performed much better than the Pupil Premium children at Wylde Green last year, who performed well below Pupil Premium children nationally.*
- ✓ *National data is not currently available but we are anticipating the Pupil Premium children at Wylde Green will have performed above National Pupil Premium children.*
- ✓ *Money was well deployed to ensure this improvement.*
- ❖ *Ensuring that Yr 6 Pupil Premium are achieving above national is a target this year.*
